MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FAMILY SHELTER UPDATE THE COMPASS ROSE SOCIETY CELEBRATE A HOLIDAY TRADITION

Dear Friends,

It is hard to believe that 2.5 years after our world changed with the pandemic, we'd still be dealing with the effects and fallout of COVID-19. The fight to keep the residents of Frederick County housed has never been more difficult. We continue to face obstacles and challenges that cause housing instability. Housing prices have skyrocketed, and housing inventory is scarce. It has become a perfect storm of marginalization, lack of opportunity, and a lack of resources.

The question begs, *what do you want your Frederick to become*? I recently had a conversation with a man who's disabled father rented an apartment for 15 years. He had never been late with rent and had never caused his landlord any cause for concern. Yet, for no stated reason, he was forced to leave because his lease would not be renewed. And why? Supply and demand have allowed landlords to increase rent to unobtainable levels.

We see the subtle (and not so subtle) jettisoning of those in need daily. Coalition case managers feel the stress and pressure to come up with the least, worst solutions in an ever-changing fight for clients. *Again: What do you want your Frederick to become?*

Despite the odds and obstacles, our dedicated staff continue the fight each day to help those we serve retain or regain housing.

The last 2.5 years have seen the Coalition take on the influx of federal funding to address and prevent a housing emergency locally through the Emergency Rental Assistance Program. The strain has been immense, though we consider ourselves fortunate to be able to provide this critical service. Those federal funds, however, will soon be exhausted and this comes at an unfortunate time when the need has more stamina than ever before.

We need your help!

We need advocates and supporters. We need empathy and compassion toward an often-stigmatized population. We need to encourage property owners and landlords in your tribes to work with housing programs. We need this generous community to continue its unflinching support of the Coalition, giving us the opportunity to build new and innovative programming, staffed with more minds and more hands to make the lift out of homelessness and into self-sufficiency.

With that support, we continue our critical role in stabilizing the lives of those without homes. We continue to rally against the obstacles to housing. We continue to make sure that those who want to remain housed in Frederick can do so. *This is what we want our Frederick to become*.

>> THE HOUSING CRISIS BY THE NUMBERS



- The minimum wage is \$12.50/hour.
- An estimated 7.0% of Frederick County's residents live below the poverty line, which for a family of four, is an annual household income of \$27,750 or less.
- Monthly housing costs for a family of four in Frederick is averaging \$2,000 per month and rising.
- The median cost of a home is above \$400,000
- 14% of Marylanders are behind on their rent, 78% of whom represent low-income households

We work to prevent homelessness through our Emergency Rental Assistance Program. We continue to provide Emergency Rental Assistance to people behind in their rent.

FAMILY SHELTER: AN UPDATE



Can you imagine never having your own bed to sleep in until you are 8 years old? We recently admitted a family to our new Emergency Family Shelter whose 8-yearold son was excited when he learned he would have a mattress to sleep on for the very first time.

We are incredibly grateful to the Frederick Community for stepping up to make this program a reality. Your generosity has given this young boy a safe place to lay his head.

Since opening in April, the New Family Emergency Shelter has served 28 adults and 35 children. Twenty-four families have entered the program, and has frequently been at capacity.

ANNOUNCING THE COMPASS ROSE SOCIETY

While renovating the farmhouse that would become the home of the new Emergency Family Shelter, construction crews discovered a compass rose inlaid in marble in front of the original entry. A symbol of navigation, the compass rose always points North. The Coalition is also pointing our clients North - giving our clients the tools and support to put them on the path to permanent housing and self-sufficiency.
